Democracy

- Children are involved in democratic processes such a voting for house captains and school council.
- School council listen to suggestion across the school and bring them to the HT.
- All children make decsions on how to enhance the school including lunch times and play equipment.
- Children are involved in making decisions in the classroom eg what do they want to learn about and what do they would like to read.

Tolerance of cultures, faith and orders

- Teachers and children from different faiths are given the opportunity to share their own experiences.
- A range of religious festivals are celebrated and reflected upon throughout the year.
- Children are given the opportunity to visit different places of worship.
- Parents are invited to speak about their own faiths and religions.

Rule of Law

- Children are involved in the creation of class rules.
- Pupils are given the opportunity to reflect on their behaviour
- Children are rewarded for making good choices with reward jars and dojo points.
- Children are taught road safety at various points during their time at school.
- E-Safety is taught in PSHE. All children and staff sign the Online Safety Policy each year.

Mutual Respect

- Positive relationships are constantly encouraged and celebrated in assemblies through our values.
- Friendships are recognised as a Christian Value.
- Adults model respect to children and to each other.
- School council are involved in decision making.
- High expectations for behaviour are in place in the school.

Individual Liberty

- All children are allowed to express themselves in class discussions.
- In EYFS, children learn through continuous provision: activities are self-led and allow for free flow.
- Worry boxes are in place in each classroom.
- Pupil voice surveys are regularly conducted.
- The interests of children are celebrated in class and during assemblies.
