Year 5: Leo recommended The Diary of a Wimpy Kid series by Jeff Kinney (recommended for year 2 upwards)


Year 1: Flynn recommended Matilda by Roald Dahl

Year 2: Ember and Stevie recommended Matilda by Roald Dahl


Year 3: Rocco recommended Enka's Elephant by Sylvia Bishop

Reception: Orla and Beau recommended The Gruffalo by Julia Donaldson


