## WHAT READING LOOKS LIKE AT TEWIN COWPER SCHOOL

## EARLY READING

- All children who are learning phonics will have at least one **fully** decodable book sent home to practice reading AND a 'reading for pleasure' book to enjoy at home with support.
- Children will be read with on an individual basis in line with the reading frequency table (see below).
- All children will be read to daily and have access to a variety of reading materials.
- Rhyming and singing is part of daily activities in KS1

## PLANNING

- KS1 will have guided reading teaching 4 times per week in small groups. This will consist of reading fluency practice and comprehension questions.
- KS2 will have whole class or small group guided reading teaching at least 3 times per week. We will use a mixture of Ashley Booth and Literacy Shed resources as well as planning our own lessons based on quality texts.
- Reading VIPERS strategies will be taught holistically not as discrete themes.
- Texts will be chosen from the Reading Spines for shared reading, story time and to enrich English and other curriculum lessons.

# INTERVENTION

• Reading fluency interventions will be put in place for children who require it following the HFL reading fluency project instruction and resources.

# ASSESSMENT

- Early reading will be assessed using the Twinkl Phonics programme.
- Children should be assessed for reading fluency using the specified age-related texts.
- Children will be assessed for comprehension using a variety of methods including verbal questioning, reading age assessments and comprehension tests.

# RECORDING READING

- Each class will have a reading folder which contains:
  - A record of reading level
  - A record of reading frequency
  - A record of Phonics progression (where appropriate in KS2)
  - Those at risk of falling behind highlighted
- Reading Record Trackers will be uploaded to the 'Phonics and Reading' Padlet at the end of every term. When children are moved to a different level, this will be dated and highlighted in the relevant colour.

# READING ENVIRONMENT

### CLASSROOMS

- All classrooms will have what we are reading displayed on the classroom door
- All classrooms will have a selection of books available to read linked to subjects they are learning
- Early years and KS1 will have books available in the classroom to read for pleasure.
- KS2 will have a selection of age appropriate reading books and some reading for pleasure books
- Reading areas should be inviting but practical

#### LIBRARY

- The library will be well resourced with rich and diverse texts
- All children will have the opportunity to visit the library to choose a reading for pleasure book regularly
- Reading ambassadors from each class will help other children to look after the library and organise it.
- Recommended reads will be displayed and emoji discs used to
- A small outdoor library will be available at break and lunch times.

### ENRICHMENT

- Our culture of Reading for pleasure will be encouraged and promoted by all staff
- A love of reading and sharing quality texts should be interwoven through all we do
- Enjoyment of reading will be shared and celebrated throughout the school
- World Book Day will take place every year
- Reading workshops and events will take place regularly to further promote reading for pleasure and encourage parental engagement.

# READING FLUENCY TABLE

Reception	All children will be read with once a week by either a teacher or a trained adult. The Class Teacher will read with each child once every 2 weeks. Children who are not at expected level or not read with at home will be daily readers.
Year 1	All children will be read with once a week by either a teacher or a trained adult. The Class Teacher will read with each child once every 2 weeks. Once children are phonically competent and reading is fluent, reading frequency will be reduced to once every 2 weeks. Children who are not at expected level or not read with at home will be daily readers
Year 2	All children on Level 2-5 phonics will be read with once a week by a trained adult. Every other week, this should be a teacher. Children on Level 6 will be read with every other week. The teacher will read with each child at least once every 3-4 weeks. Children who are not at expected level or not read with at home will be daily readers
Year 3 & Year 4	All children below expected standard will be read with at least 3 times per week by a trained adult. The class teacher will read with these children at least once every three weeks. Children on banded books or free readers will be read with every other week by a trained adult. This should be a teacher at least once in every 4 weeks.
Year 5 & Year 6	All children below expected standard will be read with at least 3 times per week by a trained adult. The class teacher will read with these children at least once every three weeks. Children on banded books or free readers will be read with every 2-3 weeks by a trained adult. This should be a teacher at leas once in every 4 weeks.
