Lunches and snack

Each morning, children choose between red (meat), green (vegetarian) and yellow (jacket potato) options, or packed lunch from home.

Drop off and collection

- Reading folder (record and book)

Home learning

Many parents ask how they can help their child at home. The answer to this is **read**, **read**, **and read some more**!

We don't set any regular formal home learning activities at Tewin Cowper. Instead, we really want families to focus primarily on reading, because it underpins *everything* the children learn in school. Reading supports writing, imagination, vocabulary, empathy comprehension, communication...to name but a few things!

Please aim to do the following **every** day:

- Listen to your child read and record this each time in the reading record so we can see what they have been reading. A detailed comment each time is not necessary.
- Read to/with your child every day and enjoy the experience together! This could be picture or chapter books, but could also include recipes, comics, letters, magazines, newspapers, etc.

Books will be changed every Wednesday and Friday. Please make sure children bring in their reading folders every day, so they can be read with.

Library

Our class library slot is on Tuesday.
Children will be able to choose a book from the library to take home, share and enjoy. Please ensure that this is back in their bookbag each so they can swap it for a new book. If they would like to keep it for longer than one week, they have the option to do this.

PΕ

PE in Year 1 will take place on

Wednesdays and Fridays and will take
place from the first week back. Please
make sure your child has the Tewin
Cowper branded t-shirt and jumper.
Children must come into school dressed
in the new PE kit on those days.

Autumn Term: learning overview

English

We will be looking at four main types of texts: labels, lists and captions, narrative, recipes and traditional tales. We will begin by recapping skills they covered in Reception, and then will be introducing and practising some brandnew reading and writing skills!

Our first unit (labels, list and captions) will focus on the lovely book Jasper's Beanstalk, in which the children will be writing simple set of instructions on gardening.

Other texts we will be using this term include:

- Puffin Peter (narrative)
- Purple is (Poem)
- Fairy Tales (Narrative)
- Gruffalo Crumble (recipe)

Maths

We follow the NCETM scheme, which aims to foster a deep understanding and mastery of mathematical concepts. We begin the term by repeating some of the learning from Reception. Although it might sound as if we are backtracking a lot, these skills help children develop fluency in working with whole numbers, counting and recognising the place value of each digit in a number.

You can **support your child** with their **maths fluency** by practising things like:

- Number bonds to 5 and 10
- Count to and across 100, forwards and backwards, beginning with 0 or 1, or from any given number
- Identify and represent numbers using objects and pictorial representation. (use objects around the house)

PΕ

The class is taught by Premier Education for one lesson, and Miss Wilkinson for the other. This first half term, the children will be doing both gymnastics and PE Fundamentals. In Autumn 2, they will move onto team building and fitness.

Music

We will be recognising and understanding the difference between pulse and rhythm. They will be listening to and repeating short, simple rhythmic patterns.

Science

Our first unit is Seasonal Changes. We start by identifying how the weather changes across the four seasons.

Later in the term, we will cover Everyday Materials. We will be recognising that objects are made from materials that suit their purpose.

History

How am I making history? Children will develop an understanding of personal chronology. They will be placing events on a timeline, making a capsule and using vocabulary such as past, present and memory to help them describe how their life has changed from when they were a baby. If you have any photos of them as a baby, please send them to Miss Wilkinson.

Art

In Autmn 2 the focus is drawing. They will be experimenting with a range of mark-making techniques.

Computing

Online safety this term will look into using the internet safely and which information is appropriate to share and post online and which is not. Later this term, children will use a basic range of tools within graphic editing software.

Design and Technology

Our first unit is Structures. We start by learning about windmills and making a stable structure. We will then cover Mechanisms by exploring slider mechanisms and the movement they output to design, make and evaluate a moving storybook.

Geography

What is it like here? Children will be taught to recognise some physical features and human features in their locality. They will learn how to use atlas to locate the UK.

PSHE

We start by thinking about our relationships with each other and others outside school. We move onto valuing difference: considering what makes us the same or different from other people.

RE

In our Creation unit, we will look at the world and consider why it is wonderful, thinking about what God wanted for it. Children will use discussion, writing and reflection to share their thoughts and ideas.
